## Introduction of colour television

\*94. SHRI KALP NATH RAI:

SHRIMATI HAMIDA HABIBULLAH: SHRI SAWAISINGH SISODIA: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any scheme for introducing colour television in the wintry; and

(b) if so, what is the estimated cost thereof and what are the details of the phases in which colour television is proposed to be introduced under this scheme?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND SUPPLY AND REHABILITATION (SHRI, V. P. SATHE): (a) and (b) No decision has been taken to introduce colour TV in the country nor has any project been prepared for this purpose. However, keeping in view the fact that colour TV technology has replaced black and. white technology in most parts of the world, it is proposed to examine the potentialities keeping in view the costs manufacturing capabilities and the technological requirements of both transmission and reception.

## Allotment of broadcasting' time to Language

\*95. SHRI SYED ' SHAHABUDDIN: the Minister *at* INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) whether it  $i_8$  a fact that Urdu kas been allotted broadcasting time

for one and a half hours only in a month at the Lucknow Station of All India Radio;

(b) what is the broadcasting time allotted to Urdu in various stations of the All India Radio serving regions with large concentration of Urdu speaking population; and

(c) what criteria has been laid down for allotment of time to various languages in radio stations serving mul-tilinguistLc regions?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND SUPPLY AND REHABILITATION (SHRI V. P. SATHE): (a) No, Sir. The Station broadcasts Urdu programmes for a total duration of 31 hours 30 minutes per month which includes literary and other spekenword programmes and music. In addition, it also relays Urdu news and commentaries for a total duration of 12 hours and 30 minutes per month. Thus the total broadcasting time for Urdu is 44.00 hours per month and not one and half hour. It has also been decided to introduce a 20 minute Urdu service from Lucknow Station with effect from 15-4-80 amounting to an additional 6i hours per month.

(b) A statement showing monthly duration of Urdu broadcasts from various AIR stations is laid on the Table of the House.

(c) The size of the linguistic population is one of the several considerations taken into account while deciding the introduction of a programme in a particular language spoken in the service area of a Radio Station. Monthly approximate duration of Urdu broadcasts (excluding news/commentary) from various stations of A.I.R. and also the duration of broadcasts in principal language of such stations
