They did not .submit thpir final reports. The Wage Boards were replaced by Tribunals for working Journalists and Non-Journalist Newspaper employees on 9-2-1979. The reports of the Tribunals have not been received yet.

(c) The recommendation of the Tribunals are expected shortly.
