Offer of the Cooperative Sugar Mills of Maharashtra

577 DR. BHAI MAHAVIR: SHRI S.. W. DHABE: SHRI KALRAJ MISHRA;

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it i_s a fact that the cooperative sugar mills of Maharashtra have offered their entire stocks of sugar to Government at Rs. 300 a quintal; and

(b) if so, what action Government are taking in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI R. V. SWAMINATHAN); (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) 65 per cent of the sugar produced by these mills are already statutorily liable to be handed over to government nominees at a price of Rs. 213.73 per quintal. A price o? Rs. 300 per quintal for the entire tion of sugar a_s offered in refore. means asking for a

price of Rs. 462 per quintal ex-factory for the free-sale portion of 35 per t-ent of the sugar. In addition this would throw on the Government a responsibility for marketing the entire sugar. The government consider that the offer is not as simple as it appears on the face of it and would really amount to conceding a much higher level of cost of production and reasonable free-sale realisation than have been assumed in respect of Maharashtra zone. The offer is, therefore, not acceptable to the Government. Further, dual pricing policy is applicable uniformally to all sugar factories in the country and an arrangement in exception to this cannot be entered into in respect of one group of factories alone.

White timers

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI R. V. SWAMINATHAN):

(a) 17 (Seventeen).

(b) The distribution of white tigers has been restricted to such zooes in the country as have the necessary experience and expertise in the breeding of tigers. Recently four white tigresses of the Delhi Zoological Park have been agreed to be sent to other zoos with a view to avoiding inbreeding and risk of epidemics arid ensuring their survival and multiplication through infusion of fresh blood.

Performance of Indian Hoekey Team in International Tournaments

579. SHRI S. W. DHABE: SHRIMATI AMBIKA SONI: DR. BHAI MAHAVIR:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION

(a) what steps Government have taken or propose to take to improve the standard of hockey in our country particularly when the standard of our hockey team has steeply gone down and i_n international tournaments our teams had given poor performance;

(b) whether Government have received any report from the Director, National Institute of Sports, Patiala about the performance of pur hockey team in the PIA champions Cup Hockey Tournament held recently in Karachi where he was sent as an observer by the Education Ministry; and

(c) if so, what are the main, features of the report and what action has been taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND HEALTH AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI B. SHANKARANAND): (a) The competitive aspect of hockey falls within the purview of the Indian Hockey Federation. However, within its legal and financial constraints, Government has been providing and will continue to provide facilities and assistance to promote and improve the standard of hockey and other games. Financial grant_s have been given to National Hockey Federations (men and women) for, holding national championships, organising coaching camps and meeting the passage cost of the hockey teams sent abroad for participation in international sports events.

(b) Yes, Sir.

(c) According to the report the poor performance of the Indian team is due to: —

(i) Selection of players who though individually good, were not in their prime and were thus not suitable to play on astroturf where youth and stamin_a are necessary;

(ii) Lack of adequate and proper coaching and phjstoaj eonditioning of the players before participation; and

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
