To provide relief to the Navrangpura/Ellisbridge areas a 2000 line expansion (from 10,000 to 12,000 lines) was planned,, and was normally due to be commissioned in 1930-81. 1000 lines out of this have been commissioned in October 1979 ahead of schedule. Remaining 1000 lines are expected to be commissioned in 1980-81.
