**Delay in commissioning of Navrangpura/Ellisbridge Exchange of Ahmedabad**

546. PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH:  
Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the work on extension of additional capacity of Navrangpura/Ellisbridge exchange of Ahmedabad is delayed;

(b) if so, what was the schedule of its commissioning and reasons for the delay;

(c) what is the category-wise waiting list for each telephone exchange in Ahmedabad; and

(d) by when Government propose to provide connections to all the applicants?

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI C. M. STEPHEN): (a) No, Sir. To provide relief to the Navrangpura/Ellisbridge areas a 2000 line expansion (from 10,000 to 12,000 lines) was planned, and was normally due to be commissioned in 1980-81. 1000 lines out of this have been commissioned in October 1979 ahead of schedule. Remaining 1000 lines are expected to be commissioned in 1980-81.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) The total number of applications on waiting list as on 29th February, 1980 was 8651. The exchange-wise waiting list under different categories and the registration dates upto which applicants in general category have been already sanctioned connections are given at Annexure.

(d) It is expected that applicants registered upto 29th February, 1980 will by and large be provided with telephone connections progressively by the end of 1982-83.
