(v) Placement of more iight diesel oil at Kandla for being moved to States which are major consumers of this product.

(vi) Advising the State Governments to give top priority to. the agricultural requirements of diesel and to ensure adequate availability of diesel and kerosene.

(vii) Advising the State Govern-inenta to regulate the distribution oi diesel and kerosene under the Essential Commodities Act and  $*^{ne}$  rules and orders framed thereunder, as also to invoke the provisions of the Prevention of Blackmarketing and Maintenance of Supplie<sub>s</sub> of Essential Commodities Act.

(viii) Advising the oil companies to tighten up the supervision over their retail outlets.
