**Rotation of officers in class I services in C.S.S. cadre**

1072. SHRI AHMAD HOSSAIN MONDAL: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether there exists any system under which Officers of the Central Secretariat Service Class I, Selection Grade and Director are rotated from one Ministry to another especially those dealing with Establishment matters;

(b) if so, the manner in which such rotation is ordered and if not, what are the reasons therefor;

(c) what is the number of years the present Deputy Director (Admn.) and Director (Admn.) in the D.G.H.S. (Head Quarters are working there (inclusive of service as Section Officer in the case of Deputy Director and Under Secretary in the case of Director); and

(d) what are the reasons for not rotating them to ensure cleaner administration?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI P. VENKATASUBBAIAH): (a) and (b) For the proper career development of officers and the efficiency of administration, efforts are made to transfer to other Ministries/Departments, Central Secretariat Service (of the level of Under Secretary/Deputy Secretary) who have served continuously for more than five years in a particular Ministry/Department. These transfers are, however, undertaken in a phased manner in consultation with the Ministries/Departments concerned and subject to the overall administrative requirements.

(d) As explained in the answer to parts (a) and (b) of the Question, transfer of Central Secretariat Service who have served continuously for a period of more than 5 years in a particular Ministry/Department is undertaken in a phased manner in consultation with the Ministries concerned and subject to the overall administrative requirements.

**Traffic rush on Baba Kharag Singh  
Marg, New Delhi**

1073. SHRI V. G. KESAVA BAO:  
•Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS  
be pleased to state;

(a) whether it is a fact that there  
is a heavy traffic rush on Baba Kha-  
rag Singh Marg near General Post  
Office, New Delhi, threatening acci-  
dents for pedestrians;

(b) whether Government propose  
to provide speed breaker and traffic  
lights on this road for the safety of  
pedestrians;

(c) if so, what are the details in  
this regard; and

(d) if not, what are the reasons  
therefor, and what other steps are  
proposed to be taken to prevent tra-  
ffic hazards on this road?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN  
THE MINISTRY OF HOME AF-  
FAIRS, (SHRI YOGENDRA MAK-  
WANA): (a) Yes, Sir. There is heavy  
rush of traffic on Baba Kharag Singh

Marg near General Post Office but  
there is no threat to pedestrians' safety.

(b) and (c) Traffic light blinkers  
are already provided. As for speed  
breakers, it is not practicable to pro-  
vide them on road getting a lot of  
traffic.

(d) Following steps have been  
taken to prevent traffic hazards on  
this road:—

(1) The road is 60' wide with  
footpath of 20' width on both sides,

(2) Near G.P.O., New Delhi,  
opposite Gurudwara Bangla Sahib,  
Zebra crossing (double) has been  
provided for pedestrians.

(3) On Baba Kharag Singh Marg,  
blinkers have been provided near  
Gurudwara Bangla Sahib to cau-  
tion motorists.

(4) Opposite Gurudwara near  
G.P.O. on Baba Kharag Singh,  
Marg, Central Verge Strips have
