The reason for congestion in Bombay Port is that this Port has been working beyond its capacity during the past several years. In Madras, the increase in traffic has been about 30 per cent during the past 2 years. The congestion in Calcutta has been mainly due to frequent labour unrest in the past.

Several steps like rationalised distribution of cargo among different ports, implementation of recommendations of the Mehta Committee, discharge in mid-stream at Bombay, setting up of a Committee of senior officers to look into the problems experienced by Calcutta Port etc. are being taken to remove congestion at the ports.

D.T.C. service from Gokulpuri to Central Secretariat

- 131. SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR SAHU: Will the Minister of SHIP-PING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that several representations have been made by the residents of Gokulpuri and Yamunapuri colonies in Delhi for linking these colonies by direct bus service to the Central Secretariat; and
- (b) if so, what action Government have taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The Delhi Transport Corporation has adopted direction oriented route structure. It is not feasible to connect each and every colony to the Central Secretariat. Gokulpuri and Yamunapuri colonies are already connected to various parts of the city by a large number of services. These services are connected at several places where change-over facilities for going to Central Secretariat are available. In view of this, it has not been found feasible to provide direct services from these colonies when convenient change-over facilities are available, for Central Secretariat.

Availability of coal ash to the cooperatives

133. SHRIMATI PRATIBHA SINGH: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to refer to the reply to Unstarred Question 1614 given in the Rajya Sabha on the 16th March, 1979 and state:

- (a) whether any quantity of coal ash is made available to the cooperative institutions for distribution among the economically weaker sections of the Society by the Northern Railways;
- (b) if the reply to part (a) above be in the negative, what are the reasons therefor and what steps Government have taken or propose to take in the matter;
- (c) what are the names and designations of the authorities who are

authorised for disposing of coal ash;

(d) whether his Ministry has issued any instructions for according preferential treatment to the cooperatives for disposal of the coal ash, if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI C. K. JAFFER SHARIEF):
(a) and (b) Coal ashes are offered on sale to Co-operative Institutions by the Railway, whenever the former participate in tender/auction for this purpose and agree to pay the highest quoted price.

- (c) All Divisional Railway Managers, Senior Divisional Engineers and Divisional Engineers of the Railway are authorised to dispose of coal ashes in accordance with the policy instructions issued by the Railway Ministry.
- (d) Preferential treatment is given to Co-operative Institutions for the sale of coal ashes and the following instructions have been issued to the Railway Administrations in this regard. In Sections where there is appreciable demand from co-operative societies, the Railway Administrations after arriving at current rates through tenders/auctions, are required offer coal ashes for sale to co-operative societies and organisations engagbuilding activities in ed in nation preference to other private individuals and firms etc., whenever such societies and organisations have participated in the tenders/auctions and have requested for sale at the highest quoted During the initial period of one year these rates are treated as basic and for a further period of three years they are varied to the extent justified by the increase in the At stations Consumer Price Index. where there is no demand from operative societies, Railways authorised to dispose of coal ashes by auction or tender to individuals or firms as considered suitable by them.
