 - (ii) Construction work of workshop, stores and township building has been awarded.

(e) Apart from projects implemented by Hindustan Paper Corporation in North Eastern Region, M/s. Ashok Paper Mills, a Joint Venture of Assam and Bihar Governments have set up a paper Plant in Assam.
