Capital cost of a mini cement plant

336. SHRI GHOUSE MOHIUDDIN SHEIKH: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) what is the capital cost per tonne of a mini cement plant as compared to that of a larger plant; and

(b) what is the number of persons employed in the mini cement plants and in other larger cement plants in the country at present?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (SHRI JAGDAMBI PRASAD YADAV): (a) According to the Cement Research Institute, the fixed capital cost of a mini cement plant based on vertical shaft kiln technology with a capacity of 100 tonnes per day would be about Rs. 420 per tonne of installed annual capacity as against the standard cost of Rs. 6.50 per tonne for a large sized cement plant with a capacity of 1,200 tonnes per day.

(b) The estimated employment potential in different sizes of cement plants is given below:—

Size of Plants (tonnes per day)	Manpower per tonne of cement
Up to 100	4.4.55
101—300	1.4.5
301—1,000	0.29-2.32
above 1,000	0.18-2.26
