(a) to (d). In May 1977, certain recessionary conditions came to the surface in U.A.E. and all banks including the branches of the Bank of Baroda faced difficulties in the matter of recovery of loans granted to constitu ents affected by this recession. Central Office of the Bank of Baroda immediately initiated corrective measures and the Zonal Office for West Asia at ABU DHABI was asked to closely monitor all the major accounts to safeguard the interest of the Bank. As a result of the close monitoring of the accounts recoveries have been effected and the outstandings in 24 major borrowal accounts which were 144 millions Dirhams in June 1977, have been brought down to approx Dirhams 50 millions by January 1979 The bank has reported that it is hopeful of further recoveries in course of time. An Inspection Team was also sent by the Bank to U.A.E. in September 1977 to carry out a detailed inspection and also assess the accoun tability of the staff so that, if necessary, appropriate action could be initiated.

THE MINISTER OF STATE THE MINISTRY OFCOMMERCE CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERA-TION (SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR GOYAL): (a) and (b). A statement is laid on the Table of the House,

Statement

(a) and (b). Steps are being taken to augment indigenous production of Di Methyl Terephthalate (DMT) and Mono-Ethvlene Glycol (MEG), which are the raw materials required for the manufacture of polyester staple fibre/polyester filament yarn. Meanwhile, to fill the gap between domestic demand and production and also to maintain the prices of the finished products import of polyester filament varn has been allowed as announced under the Department of Commerce No. Public Notice, 9-ITCPN) /79. dated 29th January, 1979. The existing level of Customs' duty provides legitimate protection to indigenous producers of this yarn.

Aribitration of disputes between Government of India and foreign investors
