- (c) whether income-tax authorities have found the financial resources of these two parties who gave bids of Rs. 1.2 crores and Rs. 1.3 crores; end

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI ZULFIQUARULLAH): (a) The Commissioner of Income-tax has reported that plot No. 22 in Rajendra Place Complex was sold for Rs. 1,32,37,000.

(b) to (d) It is not known whether there was any bid for Rs. 1.2 crores by any p«rty a_s the enquiries made

- *310 SHRI S. KUMARAN: Will the Minister of COMMERCE AND CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERATION be pleased to state;
- (a) whether he had called a "rubber conference" some times in January this year; and
- (b) if so, what are the details of th? discussions held and the decision arrived at the conference?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE, CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERATION (SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR GOYAL): (a) and (b) A statement it laid on the Table of the House.

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Statement

- (a) Yes, Sir. A Rubber Conference wag held on the 9th January 1979, attended by Minister of Industry, Chief Minister of Kerala, Agriculture Minister of Kerala, representatives of growers, traders and rubber-using manufacturers.
- (b) The Conference discussed the demand-supply position of natural rubber, measures to step up produc tion in the context of rising demand for the commodity and price aspects. It was agreed in the Conference that the minimum price of rubber would be revised soon, taking into account the various data made available there ensuring a fair return to the grower. The following decisions were also arrived at in the Conference: -
 - (1) A committee of officers of the Ministries of Commerce and Industry and Rubber Board will go into the question of the need for 'allowing further imports of rubbed and its mechanism.
 - (2) The Rubber Board will examine its developmental schemes to make them more attractive with better incentives to growers for increased production.
 - (3) The scheme for oayment of subsidy to rubber goods manufac turer exporters against export of their rubber products will be con tinued.

Establishment of dry port in Delhi

1*313. SHRIMATI LEELA DAMODAR A MENON: SHRIMATI SUSHILA SHANKAR ADIVAREKAR: SHRIMATI MARGARET ALVA:

Will the Minister of COMMERCE AND CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government propose to establish a dry-port near Delhi to relieve congestion in other ports and help the exporters from the Northern States to boost up exports; and
- (b) if not, what are the reasons thereof and what alternative remedial measures Government propose to take in the matter?,

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE, CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERATION (SHRI ARIF BEG): (a) and (b) The Government have decided in principle to establish a dry port in the Northern Region of India. However, after careful consideration the Government has come to the conclusion that the project is not of immediate priority in the present stage of country's economy. It has, therefore, been decided not to take up the project for immediate implementation.

The Government is establishing air cargo complexes at inland locations to facilitate export of products which are capable of being sent by air.
