Indianisation of Pharmaceutical Companies

1466. SHRI GHOUSE MOHIUDDIN SHEIKH: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) the names of the foreign Pharmaceutical companies which have been Indianised since the Foreign Exchange Regulation Act came into force; and

(b) the names of the companies which have not so far been Indianised as required under the Act?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI SATISH AGARWAL): (a) and (b) There are at present 31 drug companies having more than 40 per cent foreign interest and are, therefore, subject to FERA. A statement is attached showing the names of these companies. Of these, 7 companies are pure formulators, and have, therefore, been directed to bring down their foreign interest to 40 per cent by July, 1979. The cases of the remaining 24 companies are under consideration for determining the permissible level of foreign equity.
