- (vi) The Supreme Court Rules have been amended to vest more powers in the Registrar and Judge in Chambers so that the time of the Court is not wasted in petty miscellaneous matters. Other amendments have also been made in the rules for the purpose of expedition.
- (vii) Cases involving a common question are being grouped together by several High Courts so that with one judgment the whole group would be disposed of.
- (viii) In so far as the subordinate judiciary is concerned, an imperative need in many States is the creation of more Courts. This is primarily a matter for the States to con-alder. However, the Department of Justice on its own

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initiative took up the matter with the Seventh Finance Commission which, after taking into account the revenues available with the different States, has recommended grants under Article 275 aggregating Rs. 24 croresr specifically for the establishment of 538 additional criminal and civil courts *in* certain States.

- (ix) The Law Commission were requested fo suggest measures for expeditious disposal of cases. They have sent a Report regarding measures required for quicker disposal of cases in the trial courts but have yet to send their report in respect of the High Courts/Supreme Court,
- (x) Letters have been addressecT to the Bar Councils and Bar Associations requesting them for cooperation and also for suggestions for speedy disposal of case3.
