Contracts with Hindustan Aircraft for manufacture of aeroplanes for agricultural use

.*407. DR. (SHRIMATI) SATHIA-VANI MUTHU:

SHRI V. VENKA: SHRI E. R. KRISHNAN:‡

Will the Minister of AGRICUL-TURE AND IRRIGATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that orders have been placed by Government with the Hindustan Aircrafts Limited for the manufacture of aeroplanes for agricultural operations;

- (b) if so, what is the number of aircrafts ordered for and what is the number of aircrafts supplied;
- (c) whether it is also a fact that a number of planes manufactured in the Hindustan Aircrafts Limited have not been taken delivery of; and
- (d) if so, what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICUL-TURE AND IRRIGATION (SHRI SURJIT SINGH BARNALA): (a) to (d) A statement is laid on the Table of the Sabha,

Statement

(a) Yes, Sir.

- (b) An order for 100 fixed wing aircrafts was placed, out of which 34 aircrafts were to be supplied in the initial phase for use by the Directorate of Agricultural Aviation and for sales to State Governments and private operators. The Directorate of Agricultural Aviation have purchased 26 aircrafts so far.
 - (c) Yes, Sir.
 - (d) The main reasons are:
 - (i) inadequate work arising for fixed wing aircrafts and consequent under-utilisation of the existing fleet; and
 - (ii) absence of demand from the State Governments, Public and Private Sector Undertakings for Basant aircraft.

SHRI E. R. KRISHNAN: (Spoke in Tamil)

MR. CHAIRMAN: Can anybody translate it? Mr. Krishnan, you may say it roughly in English. You are allowed to say in Tamil. But now you give it roughly in English.

SHRI E. R. KRISHNAN: (Spoke in Tamil).

MR. CHAIRMAN: I will tell you. We have decided to make some arrangement here, just like the decision taken in the Lok Sabha also. You speak in broken English. It does not matter. I request you to do it; we can make arrangements next time.

SHRI E. R. KRISHNAN: (Spoke in Tamil).

MR. CHAIRMAN: Who will translate it?

SHRI E. R. KRISHNAN: Sir, the Lok Sabha has accepted it yesterday and in the House they announced.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Mr. Krishnan, I came to know from the Leader of the House. We are also going to do the same thing as is being done in the Lok Sabha. Kindly put the question in English in your own way. We will carry on.

SHRI E. R. KRISHNAN: (Spoke in Tamil).

(Interruptions)

MR. CHAIRMAN: Yes, I could follow that, but he cannot.

SHRI SURJIT SINGH BARNALA: Sir, I can reply to this. (Spoke in Punjabi).

AN HON. MEMBER: Now, I hope that you have followed it.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Mr. Krishnan, you put it in English.

SHRI E. R KRISHNAN: Sir, the order was placed for the aircraft on the Hindustan Aircraft Limited. What is the reason for not taking delivery?

MR. CHAIRMAN: Why delivery was not taken?

SHRI SURJIT SINGH BARNALA: Sir, earlier an order for 100 fixedwing aircraft was placed. Then delivery was taken of 26 aircraft so far. And now there is a lesser demand for fixed-wing aircraft from the State Governments. They want more helicopters than fixed-wing aircraft. That is why we had intimated the Hindustan Aircrafts Limited that we would not be able to purchase more aircraft, and we can purchase up to 34 and not more than that number.

SHRI E. R. KRISHNAN: What is the actual extent of loss?

SHRI SURJIT SINGH BARNALA; In fact, there is no loss in this. By HAL have informed us that the have spent some money on certainings, and that we should pay them that. So, we are taking up this matter with them and this will be mutually settled.

SHRI SYED NIZAM-UD-DIN: I would like to know from the hon. Minister whether, when this order was placed, the Government had ascertained what the demand was from the States for these aircrafts. Or was it done in a haphazard way so that delivery is not taking place now? Who is responsible for this loss?

SHRI SURJIT SINGH BARNALA:
As I said earlier, there has been no loss as such because it is not that one hundred planes have been manufactured already and we are not taking delivery. That is not the thin They have yet to produce those manuplanes. Now the demand has come down. That is the reason why we are not taking any more planes.
