

and traditional practices, household work & sibling care, migration, parental indifference to girls education, the economic cost of sending girls to school & concern about girl's safety and access to school.

(b) to (d) Although no targets are fixed, efforts are made to provide toilets in schools under various programmes. The Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan and the Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti construct several school buildings each year, which have separate toilet facilities for girls and boys. Construction of toilets in primary schools are also taken up under the Centrally sponsored District Primary Education Programme. Provision for construction of toilets has been made under the Pradhan Mantri Gramodaya Yojana. A number of toilets in schools are also constructed by the State Governments/ UT Administrations. In addition the scheme of Operation black Board (OBB) envisaged the provision of separate toilet facilities for boys and girls.

Part of the funds are provided through the Ministry of Rural Development, under the Jawahar Gram Samridhi Yojana for this component of OBB.
