(d) if so, what are their findings?

**Crime in Delhi**

(a) whether it is a fact that the Lt. Governor of Delhi has recently expressed his dissatisfaction over the crime situation in the Capital;

(b) whether Government have made any survey recently to ascertain the causes for the rise in crime;

(c) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(d) what steps Government are taking to check crime in the capital?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI DHANIK LAL MANDAL):

(a) Recently the Lt. Governor, Delhi met the Press at their request. In reply to a specific question regarding law and order situation he stated that he was not very happy about it and mentioned the various steps taken to keep crime under check.

(b) and (c) The law and order situation is kept under constant review. Crime statistics are being collected and analysed regularly. The main reasons for the increase in crime are: free registration of cases, release of bad characters after the revocation of emergency, coming up of new re-settlement colonies and increase in population.

(d) Among the important steps taken to check the crime are:— maintaining strict vigilance over activities of known criminals and stepping up externment proceedings, developing criminal intelligence, intensifying patrolling both foot and mobile in the crime affected areas, detailing pickets at strategic places and launching special drive against persons carrying long knives, daggers and such other weapons.
