Torsha River Master Plan

*85. SHRI PRASENJIT BARMAN: SHRI JAHARLAL BANERJEE; SHRIMATI PRATIMA BOSE:

Will the Minister Of AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION be pleased to refer to the a'nswer to Unstarred Question 37 given in the Rajya Sabha on the 22nd February, 1978 and state:

- (a) whether the Central Water Commission has completed the examination of the Torsha River Master Plan;
 - (b) if so, what are the details thereof; a'nd
- (c) whether the Master Plan is likely t° be implemented during the Sixth Five Year Plan period?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION (SHRI SURJIT SINGH BARNALA): (a) Yes, Sir.

- (b) The schemes included in the Master Plan are not based 0n detailed surveys with requisite investigations. Eve'n preliminary feasibility studies to establish technical and economic viability of the multipurpose dams which are the major components of the Master Plan, have not been carried out.
- (c) The Master plan is yet to be considered by the Board of Consul tants of the North Bengal Flood Control Commission and thereafter by the North Bengal Flood Control Board for approval.
