Research Programme for better Fuel efficiency

*122. SHRIMATI SUSHILA SHANKAR ADIVAREKAR: Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Steel Authority of India Limited and the MECON have adopted a programme of research for better fuel efficiency;

(b) whether Government have received reports about tests with the Indian coal for Sumitome briquetting; and

(c) whether SAIL's research programmes have been coordinated with those of the Fuel Research Institute and C.M.P.D.I.?

THE MINISTER OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI BIJU PATNAIK): (a) to (c) A statement is laid on the Table of the House

Statement

The Research and Development Organisation of Steel Authority of India has taken up a number of research and development programmes/projects for improvement of fuel efficiency at the Steel Plants. Metallurgical and Engineering Consultants (India) Limited is not directly involved therein but is associated in a few projects as a consultancy organisation. The programmes are coordinated with Central Fuel Research Institute and Central Mine Planning and Design Institute to avoid any duplication of efforts except where, because of the importance of the projects, more than one approach is considered useful.

No briquetting tests on Indian coals have been carried out by M/s. Sumitomo of Japan on behalf of Steel Authority of India Limited. However, laboratory screening tests on Indian coals have been recently conducted by M/s. Nippon Steel Corporation of Japan as a preliminary step to decide whether their briquette blend coking process can be adopted by the steel plants in India.

THE MINISTER OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI BIJU PATNAIK): (a) and (b) The Detailed Project Report

(DPR) which was commissioned in April, 1975 was received from the Consultants in October, 1977 and is under scrutiny by Steel Authority of India Limited. Meanwhile, preliminary works like land acquisition, soil investigation, raw material testing, etc. have been going on.

An amount of Rs. 1 crore has been provided for in the budget proposals for 1978-79 for continuation of preliminary works.

Demand for Government Supervision for Haj Pilgrimage

*126 SHRI F. M. KHAN: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Muslims of Mewat who have been to Mecca and Medina on Haj pilgrimage have urged upon the Indian Embassy in Saudi Arabia to take responsibility for Haj pilgrims instead of leaving them to the care of local contractors; and

(b) if so, what steps Government have taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI S. KUNDU): (a) No, Sir. No such suggestion was made to the Indian Embassy in Jeddah. It may be added that there are no local contractors but there are Mutawwifs (Pilgrims' Guides) who look after the pilgrims under Saudi Arabian Regulations which apply uniformly to all pilgrims from all over the world.
