Steps to augment forest growth in Orissa

4711. DR. RADHAKANT NAYAK: Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:

(a) the rate of growth targeted and achieved in generating forest resources in Orissa during the last five years; and

(b) the steps taken by Government to augment forest growth in the districts of Orissa which are predominantly tribals?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI NAMO NARAIN MEENA): (a) The National Forest Policy, 1988 envisages to have a minimum of one-third of the total land area of the country under forest or tree cover. The approach paper of Planning Commission also envisages increase in the forest cover to 25% by the year 2007 and to 33% by the year 2012. During the last five years (2000-01 to 2004-05), 135800 hectares of new forests has been created in the State of Orissa.

(b) The steps taken by the Government to augment the forest growth are as follows:

- (i) Creation of new forests through massive tree planting.
- (ii) The management and protection of degraded and open forests is being assigned to Vana Sankrakshyana Samiti (VSS) for management of these forests in accordance with Joint Forest Management (JFM) concept.
- (iii) Massive plantation programme is being taken up under National Afforestation Programme (NAP) through Forest Development Agencies (FDA). In the State 32 FDAs are now functioning and 27,900 hectares of forest area has been developed during the last two years.

Most of the above scheme are being implemented in predominantly tribal districts.
