(b) the details of the action taken against such educational institutes;

(c) whether it is a fact that in spite of Government aid these institutes indulge in increasing the fees time and again; and

(d) if so, the details of the action taken against this practice?

**Dropouts in Schools**

663. SHRIMATI JAYA BACHCHAN: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a large number of students are not able to pursue their education upto middle or secondary stages because of lack of means;

(b) if so, the percentage of such dropouts;

(c) whether government have conducted any survey to ascertain whether high cost of education and difficulty to comprehend subjects like English and Modern Maths without the help of tutor are some of the reasons for dropouts; and

(d) if so, the steps taken to tackle the problem?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI M.A.A. FATMI): (a) and (b) As per information available with the Ministry, for the year 2002-03, about 53 per cent students in classes I-VIII and 63 per cent students in classes I-X, dropped out of school due to various reasons including financial and social conditions.

(c) No such specific survey has been conducted by the Ministry for the purpose.
