Will the Minister of PETROLEUM, CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government tave decided to increase the prices of drugs manufactured with high technology; and;
- (b) whether Government are aware that due to the recent review of drug policy the small scale sector is being discriminated as against the multinational companies?

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM. CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI H. N. BAHUGUNA): (a) No, Sir.

(b) There is no discrimination against the small scale sector in Government's drug policy. On the contrary, this sector has been given a specially liberal treatment in the distribution of canalised raw materials. It has also been given other facilities like certain exemptions in regard to pricing, and reservation of certain bulk drugs for exclusive production.
