Statement

Staff Side Terms of Reference

1. That the first nine instalments of Dearness Allowance paid to Central Government employees be treated as Pay with effect from the date 9th instalment had fallen due i.e. 1.9.1974.

2. That the half per cent cut in the rate of each instalment of additional Dearness Allowance imposed during emergency by the Government be restored retrospectively and arrears as due be paid to all Central Government employees. The same rates should be continued to apply to further instalments of D.A. till a general wage revision takes place or the D.A. formula is revised by mutual agreement.

3. That the formula recommended by the Third Pay Commission for regulating the payment of Dearness Allowance should be interpreted to mean that payment of an additional instalment or withdrawal of an instalment takes place on rise and fall of 8 points in 12-monthly average of consumer price index. Further the sixth instalment of Additional Dearness Allowance due from May, 1975 to April, 1976 be paid or 5th instalment arbitrarily withdrawn with effect from 1.7.76 during emergency, be restored and payment of arrears due upto 31-8-77 to all Central Government employees be made.

Official Side Terms of Reference

1. That the first nine instalments of Dearness Allowance paid to Central Government employees be treated as pay with effect from the date 9th instalment had fallen due i.e. 1.9.1974.

2. Payment of dearness allowance instalments at the higher rates allowed by Government in respect of the first nine instalments of dearness allowance while implementing the recommendations of the Third Pay Commission.

3. That the formula as recommended by Third Pay Commission for regulating the payment of Dearness Allowance should be interpreted to mean that payment of an additional instalment or withdrawal of an instalment takes place on rise and fall of 8 points in 12-monthly average of consumer price index. Further the sixth instalment of Additional Dearness Allowance due from May, 1975 to April, 1976 be paid or 5th instalment arbitrarily withdrawn with effect from 1.7.76 during Emergency, be restored and payment of arrears due upto 31-8-77 to all Central Government employees be made.

(c) and (d) In the Indian Airlines there is no backlog in Scheduled Caste category. In Scheduled Tribe category, there is a backlog of only four.

In Air India, 9 vacancies reserved for Scheduled Caste and 8 for Scheduled Tribe have not been filled.

Air India have already issued exclusive advertisement for filling vacancies of Air hostesses from Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe communities. Indian Airlines are also making efforts to fill the four vacancies reserved for Scheduled Tribe by the suitable candidates.
