

The State Governments shall continue to hold their own common entrance tests for admissions in institutions within their States as before. However, States willing to participate in the AIEEE for all or a part of the total seats in the State can participate in AIEEE.

### **Status of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan**

684. SHRI KARNENDU BHATTACHARJEE: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) since when the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan was officially launched and whether the required number of students have been covered and the funds released therefor;

(b) the number of schools in various States brought under its purview, State-wise;

(c) whether any additional number of teachers were required to be employed; and

(d) if so, the number of such teachers, State-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI M.A.A. FATMI): (a) to (d) Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) was launched in the year 2001-02 and covers all the States and Union Territories except Goa, so far. The Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan targets all children in the age group 6-14 and Govt. of India has released Rs. 9877 crores to the States/UTs implementing this programme, upto the end of February, 2005. Based on the Annual Work Plans and Budgets submitted by the States and Union Territories, sanctions for 1.37 lakhs new schools and 6.68 lakhs teachers have been given so far. State wise details are given in the Statement I and II (Please refer to Statement I and II appended to the answer of Unstarred Question No. 659).
