Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that thousands of small scale units in Madhya Pradesh are on the verge of closure due to acute shortage of iron and steel;

(b) if so, what are the details in this regard and what steps Government have taken to meet their requirements;

(c) whether there is a general shortage of steel in the country at present; and

(d) if so, what are the details in this regard and what steps Government propose to take to overcome the situation?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI KARIA MUNDA): (a) and (b) Supplies of steel to small scale units are routed through the State Small Industries Corporations. The steel requirements of the small scale units in Madhya Pradesh are to be met mainly by the Madhya Pradesh Laghu Udyog Nigam Limited. Supplies to the Nigam have been considerably stepped up as compared to the previous years. The supplies made by SAIL during the first six months of this financial year are more than the total supplies made during the full year of 1977-78. Steps are under way to further increase the supply during the second half of the current year. Periodical meetings are held by the Iron and Steel Controller with the producers to review the supplies. Subject to overall availability, the

producers try to meet the requirements of the small scale units holding essentiality certificates and those manufacturing agricultural implements. Meetings are also held with the representatives of the Nigam and other SSI Corporations to sort out their problems.

(c) and (d) There is a shortage in certain categories of steel, like H.R. Coils/Sheets, C.R. Sheets, plates structural etc. The shortages are being met by imports. Currently steps are also being taken to increase indigenous production.
