industrial development 0/ Tamil Nadu

681. SHRI M. KADERSHAH: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) what are the Central Government's plans for the next three years to make Tamil Nadu as an industrially viable State alternative to Maharashtra; and

(b) what is the Central assistance given to Tamil Nadu for its industrial development and whether the State Government provides sufficient raw material for almost all types of industries in the State?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (KUMARI ABHA MAITI): (a) It is not the policy of the Central Government to develop one State industrially or otherwise as an alternate to any other State. The Five Year Plans are intended to secure balanced development of different parts of the country and extension of the benefits of economic progress to the less developed regions.

(b) Central assistance is given in the form of block loans and grants for the Plan as a whole and not separately for industrial programmes. For the execution of the approved Plan schemes, an amount of Rs. 95.90 crores has been sanctioned as Central Assistance to Tamil Nadu for the year 1978-79. The State Government generally renders all possible help to the industries

located in that State for procuring raw materials.

Regional feature films screened on Delhi Doordarshan

682. SHRI M. KADERSHAH: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) what are the details of the regional feature films screened by the Delhi Doordarshan during the last two years;

(b) what is the criteria adopted for selection of films for TV; and

(c) whether any regional considerations are kept in view in making selection of such films?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI LAL K. ADVANI): (a) A statement showing details of regional feature films screened by the Delhi Doordarshan Kendra from 1-1-1977 to 18-11-1978 is enclosed. [See below]

(b) The following guidelines apply for selection of feature films shown over Doordarshan: -

(i) Any film or other material shown on TV shall conform to the directions issued by the Central Government to the Central Board of Film Censors for certifying films.

(ii) Films which are certified as 'A' by the Central Board of Film Censors shall not be telecast.

(iii) Any sequence from the films certified as 'A' shall not be shown in the 'Chitrahar' or other such programmes.

(iv) Even 'U' certificate films should be previewed by a duly constituted Committee and their clearance obtained before telecasting the films.

(v) No film which has been suspended from exhibition and is therefore deemed to have been 'uncertified' shall be shown on TV.

(vi) Films telecast from Doordarshan should have social purpose and should be fit for family viewing.

(c) Considerations that apply to the telecast of regional language feature films are:

(i) The existence of a sizeable segment of population who understand the language.

(ii) To project the life and culture of one region to the other and thereby create understanding between the two.

(iii) Purely, on the artistic level, to show good films of one region to the people in another region.
