SHRIMATI AMARJIT KAUR: Sir, there is no doubt that the orders for some items have been placed. But the fact remains that sonsiderable delay has already taken place in setting up these two paper mills. May I, there-

fore, ask as to when these mills are likely to be completely set up in order to start production?

SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES: Sir, the ground work on the Nowgong paper mill has already started. As 1 have informed the hon. Member, machinery has been ordered both for

Nowgong and Cachar mills. It will take us about 3½ to 4 hours before the Nowgong project is completed. The work on the Cachar project will start some time late next year and it will take 3½ to 4 years after that to complete the project.

DR. RAJAT KUMAR CHAKRA-BARTI: May I know from the hon. Minister whether instead of placing orders for the machinery with one or two firms only in the private sector, whether the 'Minister' had donsidered placing the order for such machinery with...M.A.M.C. at Durgapur and other factories in the public sector?...

SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES: So far as Jessops is concerned, it is not a private sector firm. Jessops is managed by the Government of India. The orders for the machinery were placed after inviting tenders from various firms inside the country.

SHRI NRIPATI RANJAN CHOU-DHURY: It appears from the statement and from the replies given by the Minister to supplementaries that the Cachar paper mill will be commissioned one year later than the Nowgong paper mill. In view of this, may I know from the hon. Minister whether he has received representation from the Assam Government and also from his party unit at Cachar District for simultaneously commissioning both the projects? If so, what is the decision? Are they considering the proposal? one of a least of this

SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES: A number of representations have been received both from the Assam Gov-¶ ernment and from various public institutions, including political parties and citizens' committees. So, the only problem is a logistics problem and an organisational problem of having, an adequate number of people, engineers, technicians and others, who can take on this job and complete the two proi jects in Assam at the same time. We are! Sir. organisationally not equipped to handle work of such a magnitude simultaneously. That is the only reason why there has been a slight phas-ing and there is no other reason.
