## Teacher-pupil ratio

4847. SHRI MATILAL SARKAR: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government have observed that the education system of the day is proceeding more on practical than on theoretical aspects;
- (b) if so, whether the existing norms of teacher-pupil ratio are on the mode of change;
- (c) what is the teacher-pupil ratio prevalent at the national level and in different States;
  - (d) whether Government are going to make any changes in the ratio; and
  - (e) if so, the extent thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) to (e) Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan provides for one teacher for every 40 children in a primary and upper primary schools, at least two teachers in a newly opened primary school and one teacher for every class in a newly opened upper primary school. Based on the requirement projected by the States in their District Elementary Education Plans, the additional posts of Elementary Teachers are approved for Central Assistance to meet the requirements for elementary education of satisfactory quality. Up to the financial year 2004-05, 5.44 lakhs additional posts of Elementary Teachers have been approved for Central Assistance under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan.

The State/UT-wise Teacher-pupil ratio during 2002-03 in primary, upper primary (middle) and high schools are given in the Statement.
