#### **Urdu teachers in Bihar**

4823. SHRI MOTIUR RAHMAN. Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Urdu teachers in Bihar;
- (b) the number of posts of Urdu teachers lying vacant in the State;
- (c) the steps being taken to fill up those vacancies; and
- (d) whether more posts of Urdu teachers would be created to meet the shortage?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) According to State Government of Bihar, the number of Elementary Urdu teachers is 8059 and secondary Urdu teachers is 2255.

(b) The total number of posts of Urdu teachers lying vacant are 3089 and 596 in Elementary Schools and Secondary Schools respectively.

(c) Since Patna High Court has quashed the existing recruitment rules for Elementary School Urdu teachers, the vacancies could not be filled up. However, the State Government filed the SLP in hon'ble Supreme Court. An interim stay has been granted by the Supreme Court. As regards Secondary school Urdu teachers, the State Government of Bihar is first contemplating amending the existing rules to bring it in line with NCTE regulations before filling up the vacancies.
