

in the annexure. These are not all unemployed; many are seeking better-paid or more satisfying jobs.

(b) Employment opportunities for engineers are expected to increase with the step up in investment in Irrigation, Power and Industries, especially the small scale, agro-based and service industries. A scheme for margin-money to new small-scale industries has been initiated, which is expected to stimulate self-employment of engineers and technicians.

Appointments in the National Textiles Corporations

986. SHRI SUJAN SINGH: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) what is the number of appointments made by the National Textiles

Corporation for the posts of Assistant Manager, Deputy Manager and above during the last two years; and

(b) whether it is a fact that candidates possessing higher qualification than those selected were not considered for the above posts; if so, whether Government propose to have the matter investigated?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES): (a) The National Textile Corporation Limited (Holding Company) has made 100 appointments for these posts with effect from 1-12-75. These comprise 86 direct and 14 deputation appointments.

(b) Appointments to these posts are made not only on educational qualifications but also on the basis of past experience; previous salary drawn; candidate's performance in the interview and approval by the competent authority. In the case of recruitment for SC/ST candidates, the guidelines issued by the Government of India are also kept in view. In view of the position explained above, there is no proposal to investigate such appointments.
