Crisis faced by drug manufacturing companies in West Bengal

(a) whether Government are aware that a number of drug manufacturing companies in West Bengal are facing a financial crisis;

(b) if so, what are the names of these companies and what are the details regarding their financial performance during the last three years; and

(c) what are the main reasons for the deterioration in their performance and what remedial measures Central Government propose to take to make them viable units?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM, CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI JANESHWAR MISHRA): (a) to (c). A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

Statement

(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) On the basis of the information available only two drugs and pharmaceutical manufacturing Companies viz., M/s. Bengal Chemicals and

Pharmaceutical Works Ltd., and M/s. Indian Health Institute Laboratory Ltd., are facing financial crisis. The details of their financial performance to the extent available are indicated below:—

While an investigation under Section 15 of the IDR Act has been ordered into the affairs of the Indian Health Institute and Laboratory Ltd., Calcutta on the 28th November, 1977, the action to be taken in the case of M/s. Bengal Chemicals & Pharmaceutical Works Ltd., is under consideration of Government.

Self-sufficiency in Chemical fertilizers

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM, CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI JANESHWAR MISHRA): The pro-

duction of fertilizers presently falls short of the requirements and imports are arranged to make good the gap.

A large scale programme for setting up additional capacity for the manufacture of fertilizers is under implementation. Even with the completion of this programme, the gap between consumption and production is expected to be about 12 lakh tonnes of Nitrogen and 6 lakh tonnes of P2O5 in 1983-84. Action is on hand to set up additional fertilizer capacity to reduce this gap and move towards self-sufficiency.

The Government have recently increased substantially the annual quota of confirmation in Class I/Junior Scale of Temporary Officers. It has also proposed to absorb permanently some of these Officers in the Indian Railway Personnel Service and the Indian Railway Stores Service.
