

### Shortfall in power generation in Durgapur Power Plant

(a) whether it is a fact that there has been a shortfall in power generation in the Durgapur Power Plant during the last few years;

(b) if so, what was the target fixed for power generation by the Plant during the last three years and what results were actually achieved during the same period; and

(c) what are the reasons for shortfall in power generation by the Plant and what remedial measures Government have taken in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF ENERGY (SHRI P. RAMACHANDRAN): (a) and (b) The targets and actuals of generation during the last three years from Durgapur Thermal Power Station are given below: —

Year	Target of Generation (MU)	Actual Generation (MU)
1974-75	836	768
1975-76	900	1219
1976-77	1225	1283

(c) The shortfall in generation in 1974-75 was primarily due to the defects in the coal mills and fans of Unit 1 and 2 of Durgapur Thermal Power Station. The mills and fans of

these units have since been renovated.
