Expansion of power industry under private sector

THE MINISTER OF ENERGY (SHRI P. RAMACHANDRAN): (a) and (b) There is no proposal under Government's consideration to expand the power industry in the private

sector. However, proposals for expansion of existing licensees in the private sector are considered in terms of the Industrial Policy Resolution of 1956 keeping in view the expediency of adding capacity to meet the requirements of power in specific areas.

Landing of a Pakistani Air Force aircraft near Faridkot

Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that a Pakistani Air Force aircraft was forced to land near Faridkot in Punjab on the 23rd September, 1977; and
- (b) if so, what are the details in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI JAGJIVAN RAM): (a) A Pakistan Air Force aircraft forcelanded near Faridkot on 23rd September 1977.

(b) On 23rd September 1977, a Pakistan Air Force Cessna aircraft was unable to land at Lahore or any other airfield in Pakistan in the vicinity of Lahore due to inclement weather conditions. As the aricraft did not have enough fuel, the Pakistan authorities had requested permission for diverting this aircraft to Amritsar airfield in the Indian territory.

As is the normal practice in such emergencies, permission was given for this aircraft to cross over into Indian airspace for landing at Amritsar or any other airfield in the vicinity. However, due to shortage of fuel, this aircraft had to force-land about 10 kilometers north-west of Faridkot.
