Schemes for providing employment to the educated unemployed

1216. SHRI SYED AHMAD HASHMI: Will the Minister of PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND LABOUR be pleased to state;

(a) what are the schemes which Government have undertaken to solve the problem of educated unemployment in the country; and

(b) what is the number of educated unemployed likely to be covered during the current financial year?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND LABOUR (SHRI RAVINDRA VARMA): (a) and (b) Employment opportunities to the educated unemployed are expected to be provided through the implementation of Plan programmes in different sectors, such as, agriculture, irrigation, major, medium and small scale industries etc. during the cur-

rent financial year. Precise estimates of the educated unemployed who are expected to be provided employment during the current financial year, are, however, not available.

Production of Steel by Steel Plants

1217. SHRI SYED AHMAD HASHMI: Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state;

(a) the output of steel in terms of saleable products value and capacity utilisation in respect of each steel plant during the year 1976-77 and in the first six months of 1977-78;

(b) the quantity and value of steel exported during 1976-77 and from April to September, 1977, country-wise; and

(c) the domestic consumption of steel during 1976-77 and in the first six months of 1977-78 in terms of quantity and value?

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN
THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND
MINES (SHRI KARIA MUNDA):**

(a) The output of steel in terms of saleable steel from each of the integrated steel plants in 1976-77 and during the period April-September, 1977, and the extent of capacity utilisation are indicated in the attached Statement-I.

The estimated value of saleable steel (inclusive of excise duty and Railway freight) in respect of Bhilai, Rourkela, Durgapur and Bokaro Steel Plants is indicated below. Similar information in respect of TISCO and IISCO is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House.

(b) The country-wise exports of steel in 1976-77 and during the period, April-September, 1977, are shown in the attached Statements II and III.

The total value of exports in 1976-77 and in April-September, 1977, was Rs. 260.51 crores and Rs. 101 crores respectively. It will not be in commercial interest to indicate the value

of exports country-wise.

(c) The internal consumption of steel in 1976-77 and during the period, April-September, 1977, is estimated at 6.133 million tonnes and 3.493 million tonnes respectively. Information relating to the value thereof is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House.
