

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI S. KUNDU): (a) A statement is laid on the Table of the House, showing the number of applications for passports received during the period July, 1977—November, 1977, the number of passports granted during the same period, the number of pending applications as on 1 December, 1977, as well as the number of complete applications pending over a month.

(b) Applications for passports are picked up for processing according to the dates on which they are received. Currently, in the case of complete applications supported by Verification Certificates signed by Members of Parliament, Government officers of the rank of Deputy Secretary and above and Stipendiary 1st Class Magistrates, there is a 2-month time-lag between the receipt of an application and the issue of a passport. In cases of applications not supported by Verification Certificates, the time-lag is 4 months. The pending complete applications in the former category will be disposed of within 2 months while these in the latter category will be disposed of within 4 months from the date of their receipt.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI S. KUNDU): (a) and (b) It is the objective of Government to open as many passport offices as possible. The criterion for opening such an office in a State is that at least 30,000 applications for passports must be received from it in a year. Government are keeping a continuous watch on the level of applications for Passports from each State and the opening of an office in a particular State will be considered as soon as the number of applications received from it reach this figure.
