### Ties with West Asian Countries

1214. SHRI SYED AHMAD HASH-MI: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any efforts have recently been made to further strengthen economic and political relations with the West Asian Countries; and
- (b) if so, what are the details thereof and with what results?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI S. KUNDU): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Government attaches the highest importance to consolidating, expanding and diversifying India's political and economic relations with West Asian countries. The Union Minister of Works and Housing and Supply and Rehabilitation, and the Union Minister of Industry, have visited various countries in this region during the last three months as the Prime Minister's Special Emissaries. These visits gave a new impetus to our political and economic relations with these coun-tries.

The Sixth Session of the Indo-Iranian Joint Commission met in New Delhi in September, 1977. The 3rd Session of the Indo-Iraq Joint Commission was held in Baghdad in June, 1977, and the 4th Session in New Delhi in November this year. As a result of these meetings new areas of cooperation and exchanges between India and Iran and India and Iraq have been identified which will lead to a further strengthening of our tieo.

The annual Haj Delegation led by Shri Arif Beg, Minister of State for Commerce, Civil Supplies and Cooperation, visited Saudi Arabia in November, 1977.

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND LABOUR. (SHRI RAVINDRA VARMA): (a) and (b) Statement showing the number of disputes, workers involved and mandays lost by causes for the period April to Oct., 1977 is laid on the Table of the Sabha.

(c) The situation is under constant watch of the Govt, and all efforts are being made to improve the industrial climate in the country with the help

of the Industrial Relations Machinery both at the Centre and in the States. Wherever necessary, the Govt, is intervening in disputes .win a view to promoting settlements.

The Govt, is also engaged in a comprehensive revision of the Industrial Relations law. so that the Machinery, that exists for settlement of disputes, like conciliation, adjudication, arbitration, etc. may be streamlined to ensure quick settlement of disputes so that there may be less cause for industrial unrest.'
