THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI ATAL BIHARI VAJPAYEE): (a) Yes, Sir.

- (c) Government have already sanctioned an additional 247 posts in the various Regional Passport Offices. Apart from these posts, ad-hoc increases are sanctioned from time to time.

It may be mentioned that on present estimates, it will be possible to issue nearly one million passports during the current financial year, against approximately 574,000 passports issued last year. This large increase in one year has naturally led to considerable pressure on our Passport Offices. Government is keeping a watch on the situation and will undertake further appropriate measures as and when necessary.
