Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state the amount of remittances made by foreign companies operating in India during the financial years 1975-76 and 1976-77 by way of (i) profits; (ii) dividends; (iii) royalties; (iv) technical know-how; and (v) interest)?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE AND REVENUE AND BANKING (SHRI H. M. PATEL): (a) The Reserve Bank of India compiles

data relating to remittances by companies on various accounts as a part of compilation of balance of payments data. There is an unavoidable time lag in the compilation of statistics and latest information is available for the period 1975-76 (April-September) only. These are as under:

#### Export of leather

1310. SHRI M. KADERSHAH: Will the Minister of COMMERCE AND CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERATION be pleased to state:

(a) what is the quantum of finished and raw leather exported during the last five years, year-wise;

(b) what are the reasons for shifting the priority of export from raw to finished leather; and

(c) what impact this change in policy is likely to make on the leather trade within the country?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE, CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERATION (SHRI ARIF BEG): (a) A statement is placed on the Table of the House.

(b) and (c). The reasons for shifting the priority of export from raw or semi-finished leather to finished leather are primarily to create added value within the country so as to augment foreign exchange earnings generate additional employment and modernise Indian tanning and leather goods industry. The favourable impact of this change is evident from the export of finished leather which had earned only Rs. 16.39 crores in 1973-74 and have realised about Rs. 105 crores in 1976-77.
