The reasons for shifting the priority of export from raw or semi-finished leather to finished leather are primarily to create added value within the country so as to augment foreign exchange earnings generate additional employment and modernise Indian tanning and leather goods indusfavourable impact of this try. The change is evident from the export of finished leather which had earned only Rs. 16.39 crores in 1973-74 and have realised about Rs. 105 crores in 1976-77.
