- (f) if the answer to part (d) above be in the negative, what are the reasons therefor?

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration to rename the railway 'coolie' as 'Yatri-Sahayak'; and
- (b) if so, by when a decision is likely to be taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI SHEO NARAIN): (a) and (b) On the analogy of the Parcel Portens and Box Porters, the persons deployed to carry passengers' luggage within the station premises, are called "Licensed Porters" with the Hindi equivalent are a first and not coolies.

However, a suggestion has been received that the licensed porters at railway stations may be called 'Yatri Sahayaks'. The word 'Yatri Sahayak' is already in use for 'Passenger Guides' who assist passengers at stations in the matter of purchase of tickets, reservation of seats and berth'; etc. Under the circumstances, the question of appropriate designations will have to be examined.
