Agricultural Exposition, 1977

Will the Minister of COMMERCE AND CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERATION be pleased to state the names of the Participant countries in Indian Agricultural Exposition, 1977, the expenditure involved and the results likely to be achieved as a result thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND CIVIL SUPPLIES AND COOPERATION (SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR GOYAL): The Indian Agricultural Exposition, 1977 is fundamentally a National Exhibition but four foreign countries namely U.S.S.R., Hungary, Japan and Afghanistan are also participating in it. The expenditure likely to be incurred by the Trade Fair Authority of India on this Exposition is estimated at Rs. 66 lakhs.

The results which are expected to be achieved for organising Agri-Expo 77 are as under: —

(i) Dissemination of information on the progress achieved since independence in the field of agriculture and allied sectors,

(ii) Promotion of export of important agricultural products and services,

(iii) Exploration of avenues for development of Co-operation in the field of agriculture and allied industries with foreign countries, and

(iv) To make Indian manufacturers aware of the rural demand for consumer and other goods.
