Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to refer to the reply to Starred Question 112 given in the Rajya Sabha on the 20th July, 1978 and state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Government's present policy of not undertaking nuclear tests even for peaceful purposes is a diversion from the policy which Government was following so far;

(b) if so, what are the reasons for 20 the change in the policy;

(c) whether Government are aware that the Indian scientists, by and large, are of the view that nuclear tests are necessary to exploit nuclear energy for peaceful purposes; and

(d) if so, what is Government's reaction thereto?

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRI MORARJI R. DESAI): (a) to (d) After taking into account relevant factors Government have aready taken a decision to abjure nuclear explosions even for peaceful purposes, and the decision has been announced both in Parliament and in international forums. The reasons for the decision have been indicated in my statement in this House on July 31, 1978.
