

Purchase of looms by the All India Handicrafts Board

1900. SHRI SUJAN SINGH Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be please_d to state:

(a) what are the details of the purchases of looms made by the All India Handicrafts Board, New Delhi for their various Centres in Uttar Pra-destⁿ Punjab, Haryana and Jaminu and Kashmir during the last three years;

(b) whether tender_s were invited for the purchase of these looms; if so, what are the names of the parties who submitted their tenders and what rates were quoted by them; and

(c) what are the names of the parties to whom the contract was fl^{ven} during the said period?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (KUMARI ABHA MAITI); (a) The Carpet looms are made out of well seasoned wood. They are not readily available in the market. They have to be ordered for separately and got manufactured. Information for 1975-76 and 1976-77 are not readily available at the Headquarters' office of the All India Handicrafts Board since they are kept at the respective local offices. In 1977-78 the following carpet looms were purchased from the different centres after calling for quotations according to a standardised specification common to all, suiting to the objective of the training programme:—

In U. P. for 80 Centres	800 looms purchased	
In Punjab for 3 Centres	32 looms purchased	
In Haryana for 2 Centres	20 looms purchased	
In J. & K. for 65 Centres	650 looms purchased.	
TOTAL	1502	

The scheme provides for purchasing of looms at a cost not exceeding Rs. 1500/- per loom.

(b) Sealed quotations were invited locally at each place from manufac-

turers of such looms.

(c) *For UJ>. Centres:* The lowest rate of Rs. 1050-00 per loom as quoted by M/s. Jaiswal Timbers, Adalhat and M/s. Modern Furniture, Bhadohi was accepted and orders distributed between these two parties.

For Haryana & Punjab: Orders were placed with M/s. India Wood Industries, Amritsar at Rs. 810/- per loom since their quotation was the lowest. Though M/s. Farison Traders, Srinagar had quoted Rs. 755/- per loom they had quoted Rs. 1601-more per loom as transport charges, " separately in their letter of quotation and thus were not the lowest.

For the J & K Centres: Since the rates of M/s. J & K Small, Industries Development Corporation at Rs. 8901-

per loom was found to be the lowest, the same was accepted. But as a large number of looms were to be procured within a limited time on urgent basis, orders for supply of looms at the above rate were placed with the private parties also besides the M/s. J & K Small Industries Development Corporation. They are M/s. Sidiq Mir & Sons, Srinagar and M/s. Punjab Wood Works, Srinagar.
