(a) whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration to enhance the flying hours for pilots of the Indian Airlines by 35 per cent and to increase their salary by 50 per cent; and

(b) whether Government propose to employ any unemployed commercial pilots for their airlines to meet the shortage of pilots; if not, what are the reasons therefor ?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI PURU-SHOTAM KAUSHIK) : (a) No, Sir.

(b) Yes, Sir. The Airlines are recruiting pilots from unemployed Commercial pilots subject to their suitability and depending on the requirements of the Corporations.

Man-power building in North-eastern region by L.I.C.

(a) whether any steps have been taken by the Life Insurance Corporation for man-power building in the North-Eastern region of India; and

(b) if so, what are the details in this regard ?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI H. M. PATEL) : (a) and (b) The L.I.C. has framed recruitment and promotion rules for various categories of employees belonging to Class I, II, III and IV and those apply uniformly all over the country. There is provision for proper training for all grades of personnel and opportunities for promotion are available to all employees including those posted in North-eastern region as provided in its promotion rules. Further, recruitment to Class IV, III and II i.e., sub-staff, Assistants and Development Officers are usually confined to the respective areas in which the vacancies are available.

Dantwala Committee on Regional Rural Banks Scheme

(a) whether it is a fact that the Dantwala Committee has observed that the Regional Rural Banks Scheme has worked exceptionally well and has recommended for the continuance and expansion of the scheme;

(b) if so, what is Government's decision on this recommendation ; and

(c) what is the number of villages in each State presently covered by the Scheme and the number of banks operating there ?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI H. M. PATEL) : (a). The Dantwala Committee, after making an assessment of the overall performance of the existing Regional Rural Banks, has concluded that within a short span of time, the Regional Rural Banks have demonstrated their capability to serve the purpose for which they were established. It is of the view that the Regional Rural Banks can make substantial contribution towards improving the credit flows to the Rural areas by becoming an integral part of the rural credit structure and that steps,
