

New industrial units for backward areas

2220. SHRI GIAN CHAND TOTU: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) what are the names of industrial houses which have been given licences to set up new units or to expand existing units exclusively for the backward areas, area-wise during the last one year;

(b) what are the names of industrial houses which have been given licences to set up new units in hilly areas of Himachal Pradesh during the last one year;

(c) what is Government's new policy for giving licences to industrial houses for setting up units in hilly and backward areas; and

(d) what is the response of the industrial houses to this policy?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (KUMARI ABHA MAITI): (a) Industrial Licences were issued to companies registered under the MRTP Act during the calendar year 1977 and January—June, 1978 for setting up of new units or for expansion/diversification of existing units in the backward areas. A statement giving the names of the companies and other relevant particulars is attached. [See Appendix CVI Annexure No. 125]

(b) M/s. Gabrial India Ltd., Bombay a company registered under the MRTP Act were issued an Industrial Licence in April 1978 for setting up a new unit in Parwanoo District of Himachal Pradesh for the manufacture of Bimetal Strips and Bimetal Bearings.

(c) As stated in para 31 of the Statement on Industrial Policy made in Parliament on the 23rd December, 1977, Government attaches great importance to balanced regional development of the entire country so that disparities in levels of development between different regions are progressively reduced. Government would

also consider providing assistance to large existing industries which want to shift from congested metropolis to approved locations in backward areas.

(d) 40 applications were received from companies registered under the MRTP Act for location of industries in backward areas during 1977, but during the first six months of 1978, there have been 36 applications from such companies for location of industries in backward areas.

Except the mill mentioned at Sl. No. 15 of the statement, for which the State Government was not willing to take it over under their supervision all the other mills have since been taken over.

1. Proposals for the nationalisation of Pulgaon Cotton Mills, Pulgaon and Western India Spg. and Mfg. Company, Bombay in favour of the State Government have been received from the Government of Maharashtra. Action in respect of this proposal is now in process.
