- (b) There are no reports of any increase in the availability of smuggled goods on the road-side in metropolitan cities.
- (c) The main articles smuggled into the country are gold, watches, synthetic fabrics and diamonds.
- (d) The Government have taken a number of steps to combat smuggling. These include strengthening of and intelligence units, preventive intensified patrolling of more vulnerable areas on the sea coast and f.lcng the land borders, exercising greater vigilance at the major sea ports and international airports arid providing to the Customs preventive staif necessary equipments by way of motor vehicles, binoculars; frisker devices, night-sights etc. The Customs Act has alio been recently amended to raise the minimum sentence from six months to one year in certain types of cases. Besides, a number of economic measures have been taken to reduce the incentives for gling of isome sensitive items. In order to curb the evil of gold smuggling, the Government have also commenced the sale of gold from the stocks held by it.

Smuggling of films out of India

- 604. SHRI VITHAL GADGIL: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that a number of Indian films are smuggled out of India;
- (b) whether any film producers have been found to be involved in such smuggling; and
- (c) what action Government have taken to prevent such smuggling?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI SATISH AGARWAL): (a) and (bj Reports received by the Government indicate that some Indian films were attempted to be smuggled put of India. But they do not suggest involvement of any film producer in the smuggling of films.

(c) To prevent smuggling of Indian films from India, a number of steps have been taken. These i'nclude greater vigilance over the clearance of baggage of out going passengers, thorough check and rummage of suspect citgo vessels before their departure and close watch and surveillance over the activities inside the harbour and other vulnerable areas at the major ports. The customs preventive and intelligence set-up are alert to the pDssibility of or attempt at smuggling of Indian films.
