- (b) This is so mainly in cases where temporary structures have been provided.
- (c) In future, shelters at the bus stops to be constructed by DTC will be according to the design approved by the Delhi Urban Arts Commission.

Expenditure incurred from salt cess recoveries on facilities to workers

- 527. SHRI IBRAHIM KALANIYA: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:
- (a) the expenditure incurred on schemes for water supply, maintenance of roads, provision of medical and educational facilities and other development work from the salt cess recoveries for the benefit of the workers in the salt industry during the last three years, Statewise:
- (b) the development schemes which are not at present pending with the Central Government, Statewise; and
- (c) what are the reasons for comparatively lesser expenditure on these items in Gujarat which State accounts for 75 per cent of the total collection of salt cess?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES); (a) Figures of expenditure incurred on developmental schemes for the benefit of workers in salt industry are maintained region-wise and not Statewise or item-wise. Figures of region-wise expenditure for the last three years are given in the Statement I.

- (b) A list of developmental schemes at present pending with Central Gov ernment is given in the statement II.
- (c) The expenditure in a particu lar region/State depends upon several factors, like number of proposals re ceived from different State Govern ments/licensed salt manufacturers. their approval by various Regional Boards/Central Advisory Advisory Board for salt, submission of esti mates, furnishing of undertaking to bear proportionate cost by the bene ficiary licensees, submission of audited accounts after execution of work by executing the agencies for claiming reimbursement of expenditure etc. However, during cess proceeds, 1976-77 expenditure incurred in Bom bay Region (which includes Gujarat) was more than that incurred in other regions.

Supply of Newspapers and Magazines in the Jails

528. SHRI VIREN J. SHAH: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware that a large number of newspapers and magazines includings 'Blit' and 'Indian Express' are prohibited in the jails in the Union Territories;
- (b) if so, whether Government would reexamine the list and make suitable amendments; and
- (c) whether Government consider it necessary to prohibit the entry of

a large number of magazines, periodicals and newspapers in jails?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AF-FAIRS (SHRI CHARAN SINGH):

(a) to (c) Newspapers and magazines are supplied to prisoners in jails in Union Territories according the provisions of the respective Manuals. Such a large number newspapers and magazines are pub lished in the country that it is not possible to provide many of them because of shortage of funds. is no prohibition as such on the sup ply of newspapers like the Indian Express' and weeklies like the 'Blitz.' The list of newspapers and magazines to be supplied to the jails is kept under review by Union Territory Administrations.

Investment in public sector

529. SHRI IBRAHIM KALANIYA: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to

- (a) the details of the Central Government's investments in the public sector industrial units as on the 31st March, 1977, State-wise; and
- (b) the steps which Government propose to take to set up such industrial units in economically backward States?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES): (a) The required details as on 31st March, 1977 are not available. However, a statement showing' the value of property (gross block) held by Central Government industrial and commercial undertakings in different States, as on 31st March, 1976, is attached.

(b) The location of Central Indus trial Projects has to be decided on broad techno-economic consideration. Subjects to techno-economic consi derations, comparatively economical backward States are given pre ference in the location of Central Public Sector Projects.
