their attaining the age of superannuation; and

(c) if so, what are the names of such teachers and the Tespective departments to which they have been re-appointed?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE (DR. PRATAP' CHANDRA CHUNDER): (a) According to the information furnished by the U.G.C. the Commission advised the Central Universities,, including the University of Delhi, in may 1975 that though the age of superannuation of teachers shall be 60 years, it would be open to a University, if it so desires, to give re-employment to a talented teacher for a limited period beyond the age of 60 years.

(b) According to the information furnished by the University of Delhi there has been no violation of the aforesaid advice.

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI RAJ NARAIN); (a) There are 8,570 medical graduates including post-graduates on the live register of Employment Exchanges in different States/Union Territories as on 31-12-1976.

(b) The number of doctors enrol led in the Indian Abroad Section of the National Register of the Scientific and Technical Personnel maintained by C.S.I.R. is as under:

(c) The Scientists Pool operated by the Council of Scientific and Indus Research offers temporary trial place ment, inter alia, to well qualified medical personnel not holding regular employment. This provides them the opportunities to continue their pro fessional work and at the same time to try and settle in regular employ ment. Pool placement is also offered to well qualified persons who had not been abroad so that they can settle in India. C.S.I.R. also offers Research Fellowship in some non-clinical medi cal subjects to help medical personnel pursue their research interest and settle in India.
