THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI BRIJ LAL VERMA): The manual exchanges in the country are being converted into automatic ones in accordance with a phased programme. Larger sized manual exchanges are being taken up earlier for conversion. Based on this programme and the overall availability of automatic exchange equipment, it would be feasible to convert the Jorhat manual exchange to an automatic one during the Sixth Five Year Plan.
