503. SHRI SHRIKANT Will the Minister of EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE be pleased to state whether Govern ment propose to repeal the Dramatic Performances Act, 1876?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE (DR. PRATAP CHANDRA CHUNDER): The Dramatic Performances Act, 1876, was declared ultra vires of the Constitution by Allahabad High Court in 1956 in the case: State vs. Baboo Lal and others (AIR 1956 Allahabad 571). After the Constitution came into force, the subject of "Dramatic Performances' falls within Item 33 of List II— State List of the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution —which reads as follows:

"Theatres and dramatic performances; cinemas subject to the provisions of entry 60 of List I; sports, entertainments, amusement".

Accordingly it is for the State Governments now to legislate on this subject.

Fixation of the Support Prices Wheat and Cotton

- 505. SHRI CHARANJIT CHANANA: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION be pleased to state:
- (a) the formula underlying fixation of the support prices of cotton; and
- (b) the break-up of the current sup port prices of wheat and cotton, giving (i) cost of production; (ii) area cover ed by each crop; (iii) yield per acre of each crop; and (iv) total produc tion?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION (SHRI SURJIT SINGH BARNALA): (a) The support prices of cotton, as of other important agriculural commodities, are fixed by the Government taking into consideration the recommendations of the Agricultural Prices Commission. The Agricultural Prices Commission, while recommending the appropriate level of minimum support prices for cotton etc., takes into account, inter-alia., the vailable data of cost of cultivation/production of the crop, changes in input prices, changes in the prices of competing crops etc.

(b) For wheat, procurement price of Rs. 110 per quintal for 1977-78 marketing season has beer, fixed, and support is provided at this price. Support price of cotton for 1977-78 season has not been fixed so far. Latest available information regarding cost of production, area covered, yield per hectare and total production of cotton

Damage to central institutions in **Jorhat Town due to Floods**

506. SHRI NABIN **CHANDRA** BURAGOHAIN; Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the names of the Central Government institutions affected by the recent floods in Jorhat town resulting from the breaches developed in the Bhogdoi river bund; and
- (b) the steps taken by the Central Government for salvaging the properties of these institutions?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION (SHRI SURJIT SINGH BARNALA): (a) and (b) It has been reported by the State Government of Assam that damage to Jorhat Town was not due to breach in Bhogdoi bund and the flood control structure but the Town was flooded from 29th to 31st May, 1977 as a result of localised heavy rain. Different localities were inundated in depths varying from 0.4 Metre to 0.6 Metre for 40-70 hours. At Jorhat Junction Railway Station flood waters came to about 0.6 Metre above the floor level. The Railway staff quarters at Jorhat Junction and Jorhat Town stations were also under 0.6-0.9 Metre of water for about 12 hours on 30th May. However, no damage to Railway property has been reported. Posts & Telegraphs Department was also affected by the floods and immediate steps were taken to repair and replacement of damaged equipment and plants and all the services restored. No damage has been reported to Central Public Works Department or Army installations.
